The Club Constitution

Changes to the laws governing Incorporated Societies now require all Clubs to review and update their Constitution and ensure their Policies are reviewed and updated before late 2025. Pat Stuart has kindly offered to lead the work effort to review/update our Constitution and Policies.

Pat has had conversation with NZ Bridge who are proposing to provide templates for Bridge Clubs. Noting that any changes to our Constitution requires agreement and approval at a Club AGM means we will need the Constitution to be updated for approval by our February 2025 AGM or we will need to hold a Special General Meeting after February in order to comply by 2025-year end.
