You lead 3C to the 9,J and 2 – what now?

You have 4 diamond tricks and 2 in each of the black suits but there will not be time to set up a heart. Therefore you must hope for a third trick in clubs. That will require a 3-3 split or a doubleton ace with West. In the latter case you will have to lead the suit from the South hand again and it seems natural to cross to the KD. If you do,however,and the AC goes up second time ,the suit will be blocked and your spade entry will be removed prematurely.

Your best chance, therefore is to hope for a second entry in diamonds. Cash A and Q of diamonds and if a defender shows out you need a 3-3 club split. If the diamonds break 3-2, however, you can afford to overtake the JD and still enjoy a further entry with the 7D.
